## MIDDLE LEVEL SCHOOLS SCHOLAR LEADER AWARDS PROGRAM

### ***2018 Selection Criteria***

All decisions concerning selection have a certain subjective element. However, the New Hampshire Middle Level Educators and the New England League of Middle Schools urge schools to follow the recommended criteria described below. Procedures for selection used at the school must be fair, non-discriminatory, and consistently applied.

It is suggested that two students, one male and one female, from eighth grade be selected (unless your school has all female or male students). Seventh grade student recipients are appropriate if that is the highest grade in your school.

The following criteria are suggested:

- Excellent attitude towards learning
- Provides service to classmates and school
- Is a positive role model for peers
- Takes responsibility for own behavior and learning

These additional indicators may be of assistance:

- ✓ Exercises influence on peers in upholding school ideals
- ✓ Contributes ideas that improve the civic life of the school
- ✓ Shows leadership in group situations
- ✓ Shows respect for self and others
- ✓ Exemplifies positive attitudes and inspires positive behavior in others
- ✓ Demonstrates academic initiative and is willing to uphold scholarship
- ✓ Demonstrates leadership in the classroom and school activities
- ✓ Is dependable in any responsibility undertaken
- ✓ Volunteers and is gladly available and willing to sacrifice to offer assistance to others
- ✓ Accepts criticism willingly and recommendations graciously
- ✓ Exemplifies desirable qualities of character and integrity
